Parent Workshop

We held a free online workshop on Tuesday 7 May 6-7pm led by Parenting Consultant Ann Creswell. Ann gave advice on developing positive sleep patterns which was a topic parents had asked for more advice and help with in our parent survey. Despite the invite going out to over 700 parents (the Junior School and new reception parents were also invited) only 18 parents dialled in. These events take time to plan and come at a cost to school for the time of the consultant. Mrs Kendrick and I also attended the event which finished at 7:15pm. We have tried hosting events in person in school time, in person after school (and provided a creche) and online. All have been poorly attended despite us covering topics parents asked for. Mrs Kendrick and I will be sending out a survey to find out why these events are not well attended and the changes that may be needed to enable parents to attend. Those parents who did dial in found the session extremely useful and were appreciative of the advice Ann provided.

Class Assemblies

We will be holding class assemblies for parents to attend, as outlined below, during June and July. The children will share with you their memories of the school year and particular songs/poems they have enjoyed learning.

Mini-Olympics

We are excited to invite you to our Mini Olympics morning on **Friday 12 July** from approximately **9:15am - 11:30am** (weather dependant - we have Friday 19 July as a reserve day).

The children will perform short activities such as javelin, discus and different races. All activities take place in classes so, to ensure the safety of the children, they must stay within their class group at all times.

After dropping your child off, please leave the playground and make your way to the field through the carpark gates. All activities will take place on the field. Each class will be assigned a starting point which links to their class number e.g. Class 3 will start at Station 3. Children will then move to the next station as a class.

We ask that all children have applied sun cream before coming to school, and advise sunhats to be worn. Please also ensure your child has a named water bottle in school on the day.

We hope you can make it and look forward to seeing you.

Sun Protection

In support of Stockport LA's 'Sun Know How' campaign and in the hope that more sunny days are before us, please ensure that children, when necessary, come to school with sunscreen protection of at least SPF 30 applied and a hat or cap which will protect their face, neck and ears when appropriate. We will ensure all pupils have the opportunity to drink extra fluids on hot days - please remember your child's water bottle.
